4. Region and State Tournaments that will be held in Spring 2024 are being planned. Check websites for updates:
 - a. Coastal Region - February 24, 2024.
 - b. Central Region – March 2, 2024
 - c. Northern/Western Regions – TBA
 - d. Eastern Region – March 2, 2024
5. Region Tournaments registration fees- \$115 (early bird registration) and \$160 (regular registration) for Divisions 1, 2, and 3. Registration dates are determined by each region and generally end from late-December to mid-January. Primary team tournament fees vary by region and generally are in the \$35/team range.
5. State Tournament fee of \$50 will be charged for any team advancing to the State Tournament. In the past, State Tournaments were paid for in part with a portion of your Region Tournament fee.
